



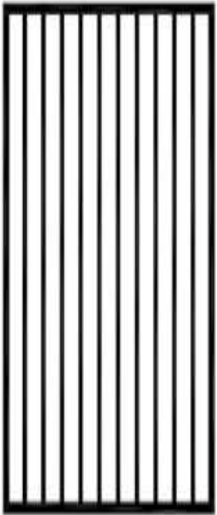
## **6 Different Types of Residential Fencing Options in Sydney**

## 1. Timber Fencing

Aluminum fencing gives a stylish look, as does wrought iron. This kind of fencing is easy to install and can withstand different weather conditions, especially the powder-coated type. It also has relatively low maintenance and won't get rusted. This is the reason many homeowners prefer to install these fencing systems around their homes. Since aluminum is not as sturdy as steel, they don't offer much security like the former.



### 4. PVC Fencing

If you want the traditional picket fence look and sufficient property security at a lower cost, PVC or vinyl fencing is a perfect choice. Depending on the style, PVC fencing offers variable degrees of privacy and requires little upkeep. For complete seclusion, go for PVC panels. However, PVC fencing is not a good idea in places where the weather is unpredictable. With repeated exposure to heat and cold, this material can stretch and compress, becoming brittle and eventually cracking.



## 5. Precast Concrete Fencing

Precast concrete fencing is virtually unbreakable due to its extreme durability, termite resistance, and ability to survive any climate. The large, weighty panels are formed and manufactured in factories, and their installation calls for specialized labor and equipment. This fence requires very little maintenance once it is erected and will last a lifetime.

One drawback of precast concrete fencing is that it has set sizes and designs. In the beginning, it can also cost extra, including the expense of installing the fence. Over time, though, it might prove to be a more affordable choice than other kinds of fencing.



## 6. Glass Fencing

If you want to keep your beautiful view of the landscape beyond your home, glass fencing is fantastic. It has a sophisticated, upscale appearance and is attractive and sleek. The toughened glass used in fencing complies with the Australian Standards and is easy to maintain.
